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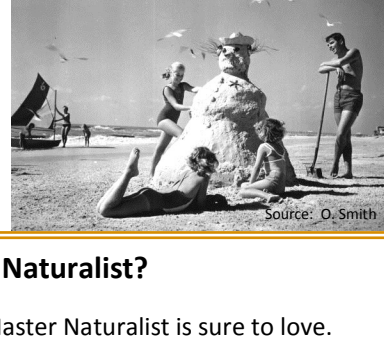
1. Happy Holidays from the FMNP!

4. Instructor's Corner

FMNP Workbooks Being Revised

Some big changes are in store for both the instructor and student workbooks. In an effort to improve the functionality and appeal of our texts, as well as decrease associated printing costs, we will be initiating a series of changes that we hope you will find beneficial. The Freshwater Wetlands Systems student workbook will be the first to be revised and we anticipate that it will be available to students by February 2012.

The most notable changes include replacing the bulky binders with spiral-bound texts and transitioning all student supplemental materials from print to disk. A single instructor workbook will replace the three separate ones currently in use. In addition to formatting changes, we will also be exploring the possibility of including colored photos in the workbooks. New supplemental materials are going to be introduced, and many of the existing ones will be replaced as they have become outdated.

If you have any suggestions regarding the workbooks (what you like, don't like, possible additions to the supplemental materials, etc.), we encourage you to share those with us. A second revision, which will entail updating the content of the workbooks, is planned for next year.
