Florida Society for Ethical Ecotourism Seeks Ecotour Assessors

The [Florida Society for Ethical Ecotourism](#) (Florida SEE) is hoping to recruit Florida Master Naturalists to assess ecotour providers in Florida.

Florida SEE is a non-profit educational organization that was founded in 1990 to establish standards for ecotourism. Florida SEE has grown into a state-wide organization dedicated to educating the public and ecotour providers about the sustainable practices necessary for protecting Florida's fragile ecosystems.

Florida SEE is dedicated to maintaining a professional code of ecotourism ethics in order to encourage an awareness and stewardship of Florida's natural and cultural heritage. Florida SEE members are asked to:

1. Comply with federal, state, and local laws regarding the protection of natural resources and customer safety.
2. Provide environmental education and awareness that encourage behaviors that contribute to the sustainability of Florida's natural ecosystems and resources.
3. Promote professionalism and integrity within the ecotourism industry by providing and maintaining a certification/recognition program for ecotour providers.

Florida SEE promotes professionalism and integrity within the ecotourism industry by providing a [certification program](#) for ecotour providers. Certified Florida SEE Associate Members are recognized as preferred service providers who are committed to using best practices for ecological sustainability, natural area management, and quality ecotourism experiences.

Florida SEE is extending an invitation to Florida Master Naturalists to become Florida SEE Volunteer Assessors in communities across Florida. Volunteer Assessors are asked to provide at least one assessment per year. All tours assessed are paid for by the ecotour provider, but assessors must become members of Florida SEE (\$25.00 annual membership fee).


FMNP PowerPoint Presentation Updated
