

1. FMNP Launches New Partnership With the FTA

Partnership Enables Master Naturalists to Assist FTA in Bringing Program Knowledge to Florida Trail Users

Association (FTA). The FTA is a nonprofit volunteer organization dedicated to developing and maintaining hiking trails for public use, most notably the 1,500-mile Florida Trail, designated as a National Scenic Trail in 1983. The goal of the FMNP FTA partnership is to provide environmental education programs to

Florida trail users throughout the state. These programs will focus on the ecology, wildlife and natural history of the various natural communities that selected public trails traverse. Florida Master Naturalists will lead interpretive hikes and presentations coordinated by local FTA chapters on an on-going basis throughout the year.
