Ask your question(s) at the new Forest Health Diagnostics Forum. You can access the Forum at <http://sfrf.ufl.edu/treehealth/forum/>. The Forum is managed by five forest health specialists at the University of Florida and the Florida Forest Service. It serves as a quick and accurate forest pest and disease diagnostic tool for Florida residents. The Forum is free to use, logging in is easy, and answers to your question are provided almost instantly.

Tired of looking for the right specialist to identify your tree problem? The Forum has many advantages:

- Get help fast, and from multiple experts – your question goes instantly to five specialists.
- Someone has probably already asked your question – just look up our answers!
- Your question and our answers will stay there for others to see.

2. Promote continuity, coordination, and where appropriate, consolidation, to better measure and aggregate results at the state level; and
3. Recognize the value in small, practical and no or low-cost steps that yield measurable results in the near term.
