The annual Florida Master Naturalist Program Conference is returning in 2014 after a 5-year

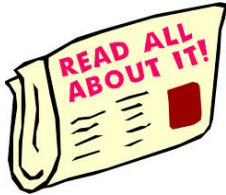

Ask your question(s) at the new Forest Health Diagnostics Forum. You can access the Forum at <http://sfrc.ufl.edu/treehealth/forum/>. The Forum is managed by five forest health specialists at the University of Florida and the Florida Forest Service. It serves as a quick and accurate forest pest and disease diagnostic tool for Florida residents. The Forum is free to use, logging in is easy, and answers to your question are provided almost instantly.

The goal of the [Florida Environmental Literacy Plan \(FLEP\)](#) is an increasingly environmentally literate population brought about through high quality environmental education. To achieve environmental literacy through environmental education, the FELP relies heavily on a strategy that includes three elements:

1. Build on existing mandates and missions of the key players;
2. Promote continuity, coordination, and where appropriate, consolidation, to better measure and aggregate results at the state level; and
3. Recognize the value in small, practical and no or low-cost steps that yield measurable results in the near term.
